

# Truck Driver Training

#### THE PROGRAM

The Kishwaukee College 160-hour truck driver training program can be completed in four weeks. It is certified by the Illinois Community College Board (ICCB). The training combines classroom presentation with hands-on experience that leads to a Class A Commercial driver's license.

The course will provide you with the basic skills to become a safe, professional truck driver. Upon successful completion, you will be able to secure an entry-level position in the trucking industry and receive 10 vocational credits.

Trucking industry recruiters — local and over-the-road — visit our classroom on a regular basis. Our CDL Director will counsel you through your job selection process and you will receive job placement assistance through our program.
