If you want to charge for your drone the Federal Aviation Administration requires that pilots of small unmanned aircraft systems (sUAS) be licensed. FAA part 107 license holders are required to pass a written exam to obtain their license. This multi-session class will help you to prepare for the written exam. Topics to be covered include small unmanned aircraft system (sUAS) flight regulations, airspace & requirements, weather, loading & performance and operation. A sample test will be administered at the end of class. If you don't have an aviation background, this class will give you the information you need to pass the exam.

Students are responsible for purchasing the textbook, "UAS Remote Pilot – Test Prep" in the Kishwaukee College bookstore.
